He said deterioration of the roof on his five-yearold home was probably too far advanced to be successfully repaired.

Barsuda Dr. resident wrote that despite a letter he sent to the company last April which resulted in an additional vent being in-stalled in August "there has been no noticeable improvement and the attic is still extremely damp.

The eavestroughs also overflow and carry water at all times." he added.

He claimed that moisture in his attic had leaked into a bedroom and living room and had rotted roof beams.

Mr. Parsons first brought the problem to council Nov. 24 when he displayed portions of a roof to surprised councillors.

If Boston Homes wanted to get around the prohibition it could simply change its name, said Mr. Stewart
