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broadcast of parts of Lincoln's Gettysburg address, and I thought at the time, if Mr King made an address like that — and I say sincerely that no one in any of the belligerent countries could do it with the same moral effect — it would be for Canada a charter of liberties for all time to come. Perhaps it was a moment of enthusiasm, but I do feel that a defence of Freedom in this time as a counterpart to the review of Nazism in the first broadcast would be of real spiritual benefit.
