Sir,-

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 10th ultimo, informing that file had passed through the wooden portion of the Reserve, and that the Indians or Indians band are desirous to cut timber from the 100 acres, addressed to the Superintendent of this Reserve, with file attached, with reference to the application for clemency made on behalf of one David Morris, convicted of supplying liquor to Indians. I have to inform you that five permits may be given to cut the burned and dry timber on condition that it is not disposed to make any recommendations in favour of this application.
