
Sir,-

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 21st ultimo, with inclosed communication from Chief Stephen Ginnish, reporting the result of a meeting of the Indians of Burnt Church Band in regard to cutting timber on the Burnt Church and Tabusintac reserves, and in reply to inform you that permits may be given to members of the Band to cut and sell three thousand five hundred feet, B.M., each of Spruce, subject to the payment of dues at tariff rate under sworn returns to be made by each.

It is probable that there is some dead and fallen timber on these reserves, and if so, it should be taken out before cutting the green standing trees.

The quantity authorized should not be exceeded.
