June 24th. 1927. 19 1-3-6 I have the honour to advise that Mr. Mackay, P.C.L.S. and I examined the plot set a-side as a graveyard for the Redstone Band outside the boundaries of Redstone Flats. Redstone I.R. No.1. Owing to the smallness of this yard it is now necessary for the Indians to have some of the graves outside the cemetery boundary. We looked over the ground location thoroughly and find that it will be necessary, owing to the surface location to have an extension made to the ease and west boundaries in order to include the land available which will be in all not more than one acre. Authority should be granted for this survey so I can inform Mr. MacKay on his return to Redstone from Nemaiah about three weeks hence. Rowever, in view of the fact that there are many applications for additional lands and meadows made by the Redstone Band (which I am mailing under separate cover) it will undoubtedly be necessary for Mr. MacKay to go in to complete these surveys at some future date and the matter of the graveyard could then be attended.
