

Canada by the High Commissioner since Prince Sadruddin was appointed to the post in December 1965.

The High Commissioner was accompanied by Mr. Jacques Colmar, Chef de Cabinet and Director of External Relations for the High Commissioner, Dr. Paul Weis, Legal Adviser, and Miss Muriel Jacobson, the High Commissioner's representative in Canada. Prince Sadruddin and his party were the guests of the Canadian Government at a dinner given on December 12 by the Minister of Manpower and Immigration, the Honourable Jean Marchand. On December 13, the High Commissioner met with the Prime Minister and senior officials of several government departments.

The High Commissioner had discussions on matters of common interest to Canada and the Office of the High Commissioner, and Prince Sadruddin explained the problems of refugees in Europe, Asia, Latin America and especially Africa. He also discussed the need for providing his Office with sufficient financial resources to enable him to carry out his mandate effectively. As previously announced, the Canadian Government intends to contribute \$350,000 to the work of the High Commissioner in 1967.
