

Accented on the third syllable.

mandarin, palanquin (pāl'äng-kēn'), indefeasible (-fēz'ibl),
sacrilegious (-lē'-jus not -lī jus).

In unaccented syllables.

æsthetics (ēz-thēt'-iks) equation, ēvangelical, gēnealogy.

NOTE.—The digraphs æ, œ, (except in oboe, ō'bōy), have the sound of ē as in Cæsar, phoenix, onomatopæia (ŏn'ŏmătōpē'-ya), except in asafoetida (-fēt'-i-dā), hæmorrhage.

VI.—ī, as in ill.

28. Glimpse (glimps), glyph, rinse (rīns), sieve (sīv).

Accented on the first syllable.

busy, cynic (sīn'-ic), livelong, lyric, pretty, squirrel, steelyards, (stīl'-yārdz) stirrup, syringe (sīr'-inj), syrup, tribune, vicar, women (wīm-en), dynasty, dynamite, līn-ē-ā-ment, literature (līt'-ēr-ā-tūre) Michaelmas (Mīkēlmās), miniature (mīnītūr), minotaur, mystēr-y, virulent (vīr'-oo-lēnt).

Accented on the second syllable.

bedizen (bē-dīzn), Idyllic (ī-dīl'-ik) In-im-i-cal, officinal (ŏffis'-ināl),

In unaccented syllables.

alkali, circuit, counterfeit, didactic, dynam'ics (dī-nām'-iks), finance, fiord, forfeit, miasma, obsequies (ŏb'-sē-kwīz), parliament (pār'-līmēnt) res-pite (rēs'-pīt), simultaneous (-yūs).

Also the ending -ain as in certain (sēr'-tīn), curtain (kēr'-tīn), but bargain (-ēn).

VII.—aw, as in all, awe.

29. Balk (bawk), calk (kawk), wasp, wrath, wroth, caldron, falchion (fawl'-shūn), falcon (faw'-kn) palter, palfrey (pawl'-fri), palsy (-zī), stalwart (stawl'-wért, not stöl), thraldom.

daunt, flaunt, gaunt, haunt, gauntlet, staunch,* taunt, vaunt, auction (awk'-shūn), faucet (not fösset), saunter, caught, bought, brought, awful (not offul), awkward (-wérd).

born, cord (not cōrd), corn, ācorn, lord, thorn, form (so reform, perform, uniform, but fōrmer).

* But staunch (stānsh).
