On motion of the Attorney-General-Refolved, That an humble Addrefs be prefented to His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, requesting him to give the necessary orders for completing the Map of the Province, so far as shall be practicable, from the late Surveys made under the direction of the Commissioners for ascertaining the Boundary between this Province and the United States of America; and that this House will make provision for defraying the expence thereof at the next Selfion of the General Assembly.
