

On motion of the *Attorney-General*—*Resolved*, That an humble Address be presented to His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, requesting him to give the necessary orders for completing the Map of the Province, so far as shall be practicable, from the late Surveys made under the direction of the Commissioners for ascertaining the Boundary between this Province and the *United States of America*; and that this House will make provision for defraying the expence thereof at the next Session of the General Assembly.

A Message from the Council, informing the House that the Council have concurred in passing the Bill “for raising a Revenue in this Province”—also the Bill “for appropriating certain Monies for defraying the expences of the Province”—and the Bill “for granting certain Sums for repairing and laying out Roads.”

The House then adjourned until to-morrow morning at eleven of the Clock.
