

CHAP. XIV.

An Act to Extend the Limits of the Town of Niagara, in the District of Niagara.

[Passed 22d March, 1816.]

WHEREAS it appears expedient and necessary from various circumstances to extend the Limits of the Town of Niagara, in the District of Niagara, Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by & with the advice & consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper-Canada, constituted and assembled, by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great-Britain, entitled "an Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled "an Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province," and by the authority of the same, That all that Tract of Land lying and being situate within the following described boundaries, be and is hereby declared to be the Town of Niagara, videlicet, commencing at Massessagua Point, thence Westerly along Lake Ontario to Crookston, thence along the rear or Town line of Niagara to the Black Swamp Road, thence along the Eastern limit of the Lands of the late Thomas Butler, Esquire, deceased, and the lands of Garrit Slingerland to the North West angle of the Lands of John Eccleston, thence Easterly to where the Lands of William Dickson, Esquire, and the late Martin McLennon, deceased, come in contact, thence East along the Northern Boundary of the Lands of the said Martin McLennon, deceased, to the Niagara River, thence Northerly down said Niagara River to the place of beginning.

CHAP. XV.

An Act to provide for the contingent Expences of Both Houses of Parliament during the last Session, and for other purposes therein mentioned.

[Passed 22d March, 1816.]
