JOHN GRAVES SIMCOE, Efquire, LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR.

Thall be given to the perfon fuing for the fame, and the other half paid into the hands of his majefty's receiver general ; to and for his majefty, his heirs and fucceffors for the public ufes of the faid province, and the fupport of the government thereof, to be accounted for to his majefty, through the commiffioners of his treafury for the time being ; in fuch manner and form as it shall please his majesty to direct.

C H A P. III.

An ACT to ratify, approve and confirm the provisional Agreement entered into by the Commissioners on behalf of this Province, with the Commissioners on behalf of the Province of Lower-Canada.

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN !

EING at all times defirous of conciliating the affection and friendship of our fellow fub- preamble. jects in Lower-Canada, and particularly by an approval of articles of provisional agree-

ment that were made and entered into at Montreal, the eighteenth day of February, in the thirty-fifth year of your majefty's reign ; by the commissioners nominated and appointed on behalf of the province of Upper-Canada, by an act of the legiflature thereof, paffed in the thirty-third year of your majefty's reign, entitled, " An act to authorize the lieutenant governor, to nominate and appoint certain commissioners for the purposes herein mentioned," and the commissioners nominated and appointed on behalf of the province of Lower-Canada, by an act of the legislature thereof, passed in the thirty-fourth year of your majefty's reign, entitled, " An act for appointing commiffioners to treat with commiffioners on behalf of the province of Upper Canada, for the purpofes therein mentioned," in form following :

ART. I. That the province of Lower-Canada, shall be and hereby is made accountable to the province of Upper-Canada, in full of all rights, claims and demands which the faid province of Upper-Canada may have on the province of Lower-Canada; by reafon of the duties levied upon wines, in the years one thousand seven hundred and ninety-three, and one thousand seven hundred and ninety-four, under an act of the legislature of Lower Canada, passed in the thirtythird year of his majesty's reign, entitled, " An act to establish a fund for paying the falaries of the officers of the legiflative council and affembly, and for defraying the contingent expences thereof," in the fum of three hundred and thirty-three pounds four shillings and two-pence, currency ; which faid fum thall be paid into the hands of fuch perfon or perfons as may be appointed on the part of Upper-Canada, to receive the fame.

ART. II. That the legillature of Upper-Canada, will not impose any duties whatfoever on any goods, wares or merchandize, imported into Lower-Canada, and paffed into Upper-Canada; but will allow and admit the legislature of Lower-Canada, to impose and levy fuch reasonable duties on fuch goods, wares and merchandize aforefaid, as they may judge expedient for the purpose of raising a revenue within the province of Lower-Canada.

ART. III. That of fuch duties as the legislature of Lower-Conada hath already imposed, or may hereafter impose on goods, wares or merchandize, coming into the province of I ower-Capada; the province of Upper-Canada, thall be entitled to receive annually, and to dilpofe of one eighth of their net produce, for the use and benefit of the faid province of Upper Canada; the other feven eights remaining for the ule of Lower Canada.

ART. IV. That there shall annually in the month of December, or as foon afterwards as poffible, be furnished to the lieutenant governor, or perfon administering the government of the province of Upper Canada, for the time being ; duplicates of the account of all duties that now are, or hereafter may be imposed by the legislature of Lower-Canada,

ART. V. That this agreement is to continue and be in force until the last day of December,
