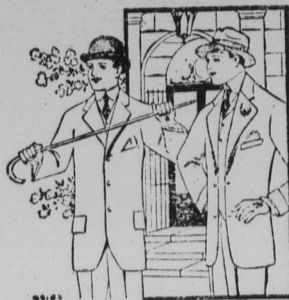

Recent disclosures tend to show that professional baseball, like horse racing, has fallen a prey to the professional gambler. It has been shown that baseball pitchers have been baited by gamblers, the same as racehorse drivers at circuit races, so that the crafty betting man may the more easily fleece its victims. Any sport which allows the gambling element to get control, has lost its usefulness and should be promptly banned.

The North Bay Star reports a heavy fine imposed by Magistrate Moore, who taxed an offender \$103 for shooting partridge out of season. Captain Irwin of the Game and Fisheries Department laid the complaint. This is a warning to persons shooting game out of season. The season commences on the 5th of November and ends on the 20th.

New Law For Dogs.

The act respecting dog tax and sheep protection, which comes into force on April 1st next, makes it compulsory for all owners of dogs to procure numbered tags, to be supplied by the council, and for killing dogs without tags. The minimum penalty for not procuring a tag is \$10. County councils are authorized to pass by-laws requiring all dog tax and license fees collected after 1920 to be paid to the county treasurer and form a sheep protection fund, all claims to be paid by the county, for which purpose valuers are to be appointed. Sheep are certainly of more value to any community than dogs and ought to be protected.
