During the month of July domestics exports reached \$45,600,000 and foreign goods exported from Canada \$16,000,000, compared with \$41,000,000 domestic and \$8,000,000 foreign for the corresponding month of 1914. FOR CROP MOVEMENT Minister of Finance Offers to Co-

operate With Banks.

The Minister of Finance has special drawn the attention of the Bankers' Association to the provisions of the Finance Act of 1914, under which advances may be obtained in Dominion notes upon approved collateral. The Minister thinks that the Canadian crop will this year be unusually large and valuable, but that owing to war conditions and the state of the exchanges the movement will likely be slow. This means that the financial demands in connection with the crop movement will be heavier and more prolonged than previously.
