#### Canadian National Railways Operated at a Loss of Just \$14,000,000 During Past Year

OTTAWA, March 31-The Cana-, in wages lian National Railways operated at

loss of \$47,000,000 durin ghe fiscal year ended on March 31, 1919, according to the first annual budget submitted to the house of commons today by Dr. Reid, minister of railways.

The budget shows the loss divided as follows:

Canadian Northern, \$6,500,000, and International Railway and Transcontinetal, \$7,500,000.

ALL persons residing in Canada, employed in Canada, or carrying on business in Canada, are liable to a tax on income, as follows:-

1. Every unmarried person, or widow, or widower, without dependants as defined by the Act, who during the calendar year 1919 received or earned \$1,000 or more.

2. All other individuals who during? the calendar year 1919 received or earned \$2,000

 Every corporation and joint stock company whose profits exceeded \$2,000 during the fiscal year ended in 1919.

Forms to be used in filing returns on or before the 30th of April, 1920.

ALL INDIVIDUALS other than farmers and ranchers must use Form T-1.

FARMERS AND RANCHERS must use Form T 1A. CORPORATIONS and joint stock companies must use Form
