Borden's conference with naval authorities has reference to statement of naval policy which Churchill will make on Monday. It is believed that Borden will not offer the equivalent of two Dreadnoughts as expected.

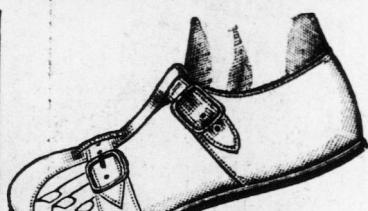
