Notes From Brigus.

On Friday night the 30th ult., a very instructive and interesting lecture on "The Call of the People" was given by the Rev. J. W. Bartlett. An outstanding feature of the event was some excellent lantern slides. The Academy Hall was well filled. Instead of the regular method of an admission fee a collection was taken at the door.

Mr. Michael Byrne arrived by Thursday night's train from Boston where he had been working during the past winter. He was accompanied by his brother Bernard and family, who proceeded to Mrs. Byrne's home-town--Bay Roberts--to spend a holiday.

Mr. H. M. Hearn, of the Heart's Content Cable Staff, who had been in town on a month's leave, returned to work on the 30th ult., having spent an enjoyable holiday.

We learn that Mr. Jas. P. Hearn has gone on a surveying trip to Bonaville Bay.

On Monday, the 3rd inst., a meeting of the Agricultural Board was held at which the potato situation was freely discussed. We learn the Board is offering canker-proof potatoes to the public at \$8.80 per barrel.

The death occurred on the 3rd inst., of Mrs. Maria Breaker, who had attained the ripe old age of 86 years. The funeral took place on Wednesday to the Methodist Cemetery and was largely attended.

The attention of His Worship the Magistrate was directed on Tuesday evening to the hearing of an assault case, in which the complainant and defendant respectively were male and female residents of a nearby settlement. It appears neither of the parties concerned can be said to possess "mens sana in corpore sano," at least this was applicable to the complainant after the happening, for the defendant had shown surprising strength and accuracy in the hurling of stones at her opponent.

Mr. William Gushue, a well known and highly respected resident of Riverhead, passed to the Great Beyond rather suddenly on Tuesday morning. Although he had been in failing health during the past winter, his death at this period was unexpected, as only a week previously he had been well enough to get out of doors. He leaves to mourn their sad loss a wife, two daughters, Mrs. Jas. King and Beatrice at home, and two sons, one in Canada and Ernest at home, to all of whom we extend our sincere sympathy. His funeral took place this afternoon and was very largely attended, the L.O.A. being present in a body to pay their last respects to a deceased member.

On Wednesday night in the Methodist Academy Hall, a meeting was held for the purpose of addressing arguments in favor of the present Prohibition Act. On the platform were J. P. Thompson, Esq., J.P., Chairman, Revs. Caldwell, Jackson and Higgin, of St. John's, the latter by the kind invitation of the resident clergyman. The chairman opened with a short speech in which he expressed his approval of the present law, in that it greatly reduced the number of boarders at H. M. Penitentiary. The next speaker was the Rev. E. K. H. Caldwell who felt that prohibition was a benefit and a necessity to any country. The chairman now introduced Rev. W. J. R. Higgin, who in an eloquent address told of the evils of the old days of the open saloon. He was of the opinion that any attempt at modification as proposed would have drastic effects on the welfare and well-being of the future generation. Rev. Oliver Jackson next took the platform and in an eloquent and impressive speech called upon his hearers to be up and doing. "It is not the fault of the Act," said he, "that some have plenty and others none, but the fault lies with the people themselves. They should assist in carrying out the law. After the speakers had dealt exhaustively with the matter, opportunity was given members of the audience to express their opinions. This was availed of by two of those present whose remarks--though by no means eloquent--were none the less truthful and convincing. A petition was presented by Mr. H. Chafe protesting against modification, on which a standing vote was taken in which we are told some members who have been well acquainted with the workings and "blessings" of the present system, participated.
