Social Service Council. OFFICERS ELECTED—REPORTS SUBMITTED.

Despite the very disagreeable weather, there was a good meeting of the Social Service Council at the Presbyterian Hall last night, for the election of officers, and transaction of general business. Rev. Canon Bolt, D.C.L., 1st President, presided. The report of the Executive Committee was read and adopted, as was also that of the Treasurer. A general discussion followed the reports, which were participated in by various ladies and gentlemen present. The election of officers resulted as follows:

President—Rev. Canon Bolt, D.C.L. 1st Vice President—Dr. C. Macpherson. 2nd Vice President—Mrs. David Baird. 3rd Vice President—Rev. T. B. Davy. Secretary—H. Y. Mott. Treasurer—F. Bradshaw. The following is the Executive Committee:—Rev. R. J. Power, Mrs. E. G. H. Hutcheon, Mrs. J. Peterson, Mrs. Geo. House, Dr. W. H. Parsons, Miss M. Furlong, Mr. George Langmead, Rev. E. C. Barr, Mrs. A. Hiscock, Mrs. V. P. Burke, Capt. Crann, S.A., Rev. R. E. Falbraun, Miss I. Hayward, Mrs. J. S. Benedict.

Following the election of officers the President commented briefly on the work of the Council since its inception and referred to various details connected therewith. He referred gratefully to the opportunities for united effort in social work which membership in the Council afforded, and hoped that the future might show even greater success than the past. Appended is the report of the Executive Committee for 1922.

REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

Your Executive Committee present the following for consideration. Since last annual meeting, the Executive has had under consideration several matters of importance. The Act for the Protection of Neglected, Dependent, and Delinquent Children, which had engaged the Council's attention for a long time, was finally passed at the last session of the Legislature and is now in operation.

In response to the efforts of the Executive, and largely due to the representations of Doctors Macpherson and Parsons, the Government appointed a Board of Inquiry, which, at the 1921 session of the Legislature, passed an Act for the prevention of Social Disease, which gives power to deal efficiently and effectively with what bade fair to become a scourge in the country. We are advised that much benefit has resulted from this Act.

At present, a proposal from the Govt. Picture Shows has been engaging considerable attention. It is but fair to say that all the managers have evinced a willingness to listen to the reformatory representations made to them, and meet the views of the Executive as far as possible.

At present, a proposal from the Government, concerning the censorship of Moving Pictures, is being considered by a sub-committee of the Executive, so that definite action may be speedily taken. The question of Child Welfare and kindred matters have received attention, and have been dealt with as occasion offered.

From the initiation of the Social Service Council, and throughout their residence in the Colony, the Revs. D. B. Hemmen, Edgar Jones, and Gordon Dickie, were amongst the leaders of the movement, devoting much energy and interest for its advance and usefulness. All three merit the gratitude and thanks of the Council for their enthusiasm and unselfish efforts towards its success.

Your Committee desires to draw attention to the fact that the Social Service Council is composed of members of all denominations, and representatives of various organizations. There is abundant evidence to prove that there is a great and pressing need for all who have the Social Welfare of the city, and the country, at heart, to combine in the endeavor to make life happier and healthier for those who from various causes, need a helping hand.
