The Conservatives thought they would steal a march on the Reformers in this matter, but the latter were too wide awake for their Tory friends, discovered their little game in time, and met them with sides. So far, we believe, the decisions of the Court have been on the whole satis-factory, and we hope they will continue to mete out equal justice to both sides, and leave only those names on the roll which have a right to be there.
