RECIPROCITY TALK GOES ON SLOWLY

First Steps Toward an Amicable Arrangement Taken at Yesterday's Meeting.

Ottawa, Ont., Nov. 7.-The reciprocity commissioners representing the United States and Canada, in a two-hour session today, took the first steps towards formulating a scheme of tariff concessions, which, it is believed, will stimulate international commerce. While no announcement was made as to the course taken by the negotiations, there was an apparent feeling of satisfaction among the commissioners, and a belief that the work on reaching an amicable agree

ment will not prove difficult. It is understood that Canada made tentative suggestion of tariff reduction by the United States on the Dominion's natural products, at the same time offering concessions on some lines of manufactures, such as steel shapes and agricultural machinery.


