

SLENDER THREAD HOLDS PEACE OF EUROPE

London, Nov. 25.—The extreme anxiety manifested by the European governments to deny the reports of warlike preparations and to represent the political situation as peaceful and satisfactory is in itself an indication of how slender a thread the issues of peace and war in Europe now hang.

The danger arises not alone from the conflicting interests of Austria, Serbia and other powers, but from the possibility that Turkey, following the traditional policy of profiting by the embroilment of the great powers, may adopt an irreconcilable attitude in the peace negotiations.

Beyond the fact that the plenipotentiaries met today, nothing is yet known—whether an armistice has been arranged. There appears to be a suspension of operations at Tchataldja, apparently by tacit consent rather than by formal government.

TURKEY PLAYING DOUBLE.
"The semi-official Bulgarian newspaper, the Mir, in an editorial, voices the governmental irritation at Turkey's dilatory methods of negotiation, and accuses the Porte of deliberately nominating delegates from remote points in order to gain time. This probably refers to Osman Kizami Pasha, the ambassador to Germany, who only arrived at Constantinople from Berlin today.

In the diplomatic field the most important reports are that Serbia declines to reply to the Austrian demands until the war is concluded, and that Germany has not undertaken to mediate between Austria and Russia. The news that Serbia is throwing further obstacles in the way of the Austrian representative in search of Prochaska, the Austrian consul at Trieste, is another disquieting factor around Adrianople, where the besieging forces are reported to have drawn their investing circle to within two-thirds of a mile of the town.

THROWS COLD WATER ON FEMALE IMMIGRATION SCHEME

Harcourt Says That Exodus of Women to Canada Is Increasing Every Year.

London, Nov. 25.—Colonel Yates, calling attention to the decision of the Canadian Government to establish a woman's immigration branch in England, asked if Colonial Secretary Harcourt would consider the question of forming an imperial emigration board with the overseas representatives to go thoroughly into the question of women's emigration. The excess of female over male adults in 1911 was nearly a million and a half.

Hon. Mr. Harcourt was not prepared under present circumstances to consider the question of forming such a board. The subject, he said, is under consideration of the Dominion's royal commission. It has not been considered necessary for the British Government to offer any special encouragement to female emigration.

Col. Yates—Will His Majesty's Government take no steps whatever? Hon. Mr. Harcourt—I don't think there is any necessity, for female emigration to Canada and other parts of the dominions has been greater in the last twelve months than at any previous period.

Liverpool, Nov. 25.—John Rogers & Co. reported that receipts at Birkenhead today remained about the same. The demand is good and quotations may be given the same as Saturday, say 11s. 12d. to 12s. 6d. for Irish steers.

TORONTO, Nov. 25.—Once more there were more buyers than sellers at the city stockyards on the opening day of the week. A fair representation of buyers wanted good butchers and stockers.

There were practically no stockers to be had, and offerings of butchers were few. For what was sold prices were firm. Several buyers went away without being able to supply their needs.

There seems no reason for the continued shortage of live stock at the city market except that drovers have been ignorant of the situation. Men were in the market with orders to buy stock, but they went away unsatisfied. Park, Blackwell & Co. is negotiating to secure property in the city stock yards for the purpose of building a new packing establishment. The idea is to make the city stock yards a base of supply for the firm. Good butcher steers and heifers brought from \$5.50 to \$5.75 per cwt. good medium, \$5.25 to \$5.50; rough to medium, \$4.75 to \$5.00. Hogs were quoted at \$5.10, fed and watered, \$5.25 to \$5.50. Receipts were cars, containing 180 cattle, 55 sheep and 52 calves. A. W. Mayne bought one cow, \$1,150 lbs. at \$5.75; three rough cows, 1,025 lbs. at \$5.75. W. J.
