Important Changes in the Salling Rules-Officers Elected at the Second Annual. The second annual meeting of the above ronto Sailing Skiff Club, President George H. Gooderham in the chair. Hon. Secreing clubs were present: E. H. Ambrose, With proxies from the koyal handows. Yacht Club; Captain T. A. E. World and Messrs. E. A. Apted, D. G. World and A. Skinner from the Royal Toronto Sailing Skiff Club, and J. E. Taylor from the Victoria Yacht Club of Hamilton, whose application for membership to the association was read and granted by unanimous vote of those present. J. E. Taylor spoke right royally on behalf of his club. After the minutes of the last annual meeting were read the delegates went into committee to discuss the following amendments, which were adopted, and a recommendation passed that the sailing rules as amended should stand for three years.

Article 1, section 4. To read: Any dispute or protest which may arise among skiffs taking part in any such race, shall be decided by the Sailing Committee of the club holding it. Should the member protesting or protested think such decision unfair he shall have the right of appeal to the Executive of the association by giving notice of appeal in writing to the Yacht Club; Captain T. A. E. World and

right of appeal to the Executive of the association by giving notice of appeal in writing to the hon. secretary-treasurer within one week after the decision appealed from. The decision of the Executive shall be final on any question that may be brought before them. The member appealing shall at the time of making his appeal deposit \$5 with the hon. secretary-treasurer of the association, which amount, if the appeal be unsuccessful, shall be forfeited to the association.

Article 2, section 1. A sailing skiff shall not be more than 20 feet, W.L., L.W.L.. and for the first-class of less than four and a half feet beam, for the second-class of less than four feet beam, and for the third-class of less than three and a half feet beam, and shall carry no "kicking board" or hallast, except centre board, which shall not weigh more than 200 pounds for the first-class, than 150 pounds for the second-class, or than 100 pounds for the third-class. Skiffs built prior to Nov. 1, 1893, stands. Section 4. No skiff shall be allowed to compete unless she is sufficiently buoyant, in case of



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
