**The Duluth and Winnipeg.**

The Minneapolis *Mississippi Valley Lumberman* says: The bill which has been introduced in the Minnesota legislature to forfeit the land grant of the Duluth & Winnipeg railway company is likely to excite a hot contest before it is disposed of. The Manitoba railway company is urging the passage of the bill and it is reported that already a strong lobby is being organized to secure the passage of the bill on the one hand, and prevent its passage on the other. This same land grant has several times previously been the subject of sharp contests. The lumbermen in Minnesota have reason for deep interest in the dispute involved. If the Duluth & Winnipeg is built it will exert an immense influence in the development of that portion of Minnesota north of the Northern Pacific railroad. It will afford an expeditious means of getting into the woods in place of the tedious methods now required. Now that there is a fair chance that the road will be built with the aid of the grant, the sympathies of the lumbermen will be with the Duluth & Winnipeg company even though the corporation has been derelict in doing what it was organized to do.
