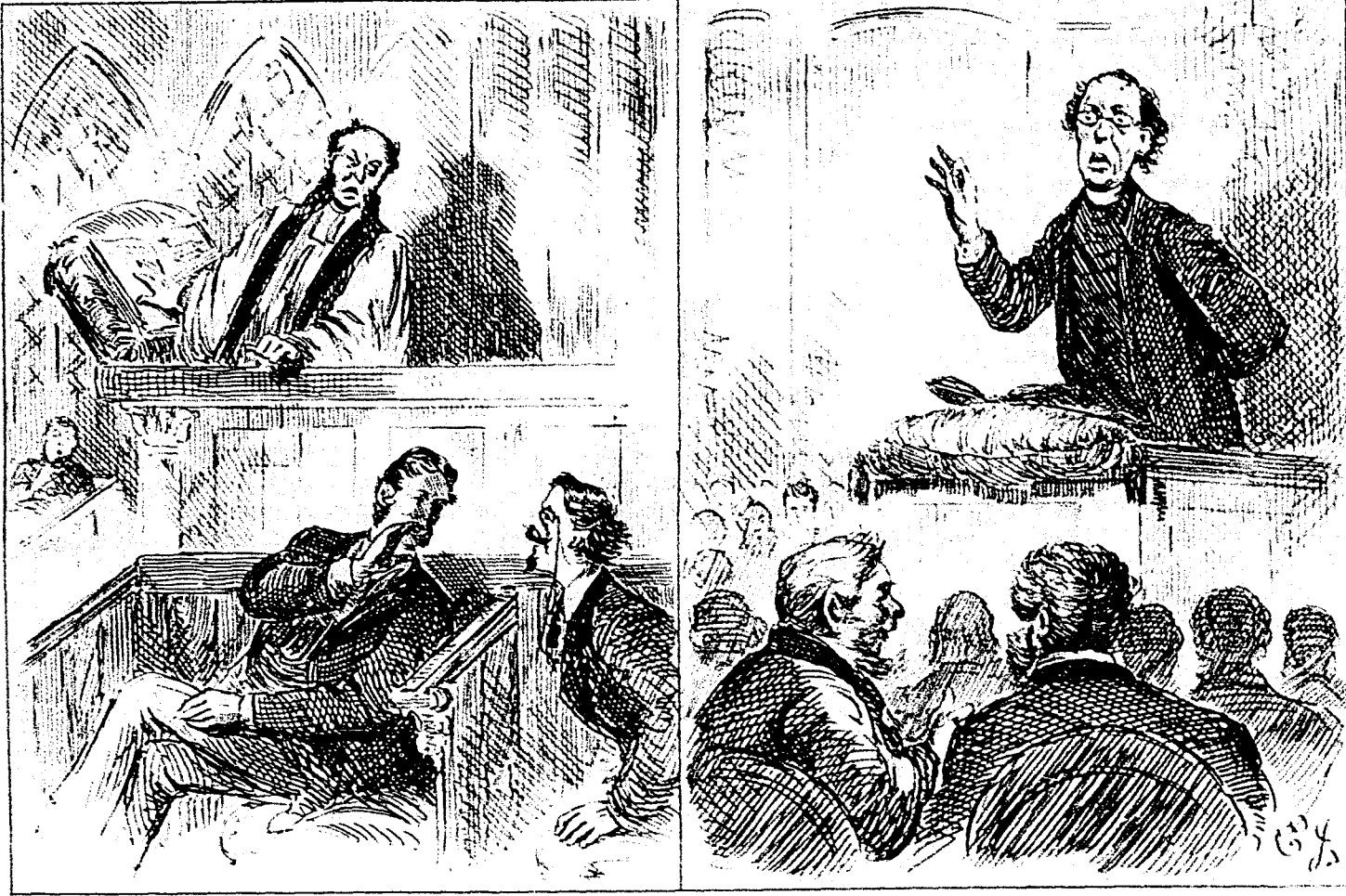


WHISPERS IN CHURCH.

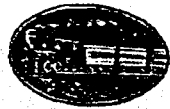
