RIFLE RANGE EXPERIENCES IN THE WEST.

EDITOR MILITIA GAZETTE,—The matches of the Manitoba Rifle Association took place at Stoney Mountain last week. The mountain is a ridge about 60 feet high forming a sort of basin of irregular shape, about 13 miles northwest of Winnipeg. A special train was run during the tournament, leaving Winnipeg about 8 a.m. After nearly an hour's run, the competitors and friends were dropped on the prairie about three-quarters of a mile from the butts, and wended their way over the first ridge. Evidently preparations for something on a large scale had been made. Numerous tents were erected, flags flying, and a zig-zag range of targets about ten in number looked as if the engineer who laid them out had first been laid out himself. Apart from the mechanical part it is a fine place for a rifle range, but ridiculously far from the city. The secretary and his assistant were kept busy for a time taking the entries, but by ten o'clock everything seemed in readiness and a general move was made to the 200 yards, where the first match was to be fired. Arrived there a delay took place while the sergeant in the butts paraded his markers on top of the bank, each in front of his target. Whether this was done in the way of discipline, or to show the markers who were shooting, or for the satisfaction of the shootists, has not yet been clearly ascertained. After a time, far too long for any useful purpose, they dived down into their holes and the targets began to move; one would be raised, then lowered, and finally one of the markers appeared at the end and made tracks for the secretary's tent at the 600 yards range; soon another followed suit, and by and by the cause became known, when one appeared with signal disc, another with patches, and a third with paste; but patience is always rewarded, and about eleven o'clock firing began, and the first competition was finished at noon with an entry of about 50 competitors.
