

Article VIPERMITTED ACTIVITIES<sup>\*/</sup>

Each State Party has the right, in accordance with the provisions of this Convention, to develop,<sup>\*\*/</sup> produce, otherwise acquire, retain, transfer and use toxic chemicals and their precursors for permitted purposes, in types and quantities consistent with such purposes, subject to the following:

1. Each State Party shall, within 30 days of the entry into force of the Convention for itself, declare the possession for permitted purposes of chemicals, posing a special danger from the viewpoint of their possible diversion to chemical weapons purposes, within its territory and anywhere under its jurisdiction or control, indicating the scientific names, [the structural formula] and the quantities for each individual category:

- (a) super-toxic lethal chemicals;
- (b) key components of binary and/or multicomponent chemical systems for chemical weapons, listed in ...
- (c) other lethal chemicals, listed in ...;
- (d) harmful chemicals, listed in ...;
- (e) key precursors, listed in ...;
- (f) other chemicals posing special risk, listed in ... .

2. Each State Party shall declare annually, for its territory, anywhere under its jurisdiction or control<sup>\*\*\*/</sup>, the quantity<sup>\*\*\*\*/</sup> of:
