

## THE SENATE OF CANADA

### BILL X<sup>2</sup>.

An Act for the relief of Ernest Arthur Allen.

Preamble.

**W**HEREAS Ernest Arthur Allen, domiciled in Canada and residing at the city of Verdun, in the province of Quebec, typewriter mechanic, has by his petition alleged that on the fourth day of June, A.D., 1931, at the said city, he and Jane Wardrobe Brown, who was then of the said 5 city, a spinster, were married; and whereas by his petition he has prayed that, because of her adultery since then, their marriage be dissolved; and whereas the said marriage and adultery have been proved by evidence adduced and it is expedient that the prayer of his petition be granted: 10 Therefore His Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

Marriage dissolved.

**1.** The said marriage between Ernest Arthur Allen and Jane Wardrobe Brown, his wife, is hereby dissolved, and 15 shall be henceforth null and void to all intents and purposes whatsoever.

Right to marry again.

**2.** The said Ernest Arthur Allen may at any time hereafter marry any woman whom he might lawfully marry if the said marriage with the said Jane Wardrobe Brown had 20 not been solemnized.
