FEDERAL SUPPORT FOR FILM SOCIETIES, ETC.

Question No. 429—**Mr. Roberts:** (Supplementary)

Does the Government of Canada provide any financial support for film societies, film museums or cinemathèques in Canada and, if so, what has been the amount expended for this purpose for each year since 1963?

Mr. Yves Forest (Parliamentary Secretary to President of the Privy Council): In so far as the Centennial Commission is concerned the answer is as follows: The following grants were made by the commission during 1967: La Cinematique Canadienne, \$33,000.00; Canadian Film Institute, \$26,000.00; Association of Amateur Cinematographers, \$400.00.

In so far as the National Film Board is concerned the answer is as follows: Since 1963-64 the National Film Board has entered into contract annually with the Canadian Film Institute in the amount of \$20,000 for which services, including the maintenance of film libraries, film catalogues and listings by subject and general information for the public on films are provided.

In 1965-66, the board contracted with La Cinematique Canadienne in the amount of \$8,000 to produce, co-ordinate and distribute an exhibit in Canada and Europe of the work of Norman McLaren.

In 1967-68 and 1968-69, the Board made grants of \$1,000 and \$2,000 respectively to the Canadian Film Awards.

In so far as the National Research Council of Canada is concerned the answer is as follows: 1962-63, \$24,500.00; 1963-64, \$24,500.00; 1964-65, \$24,500.00; 1965-66, \$24,500.00; 1966-67, \$24,500.00; 1967-68, \$29,500.00.

The amounts listed are the financial support given to the National Science Film Library which was established in 1962 and which is operated by the Canadian Film Institute under contract with the National Research Council.

Dr. Grant Carman (Chairman): (a) Director of information, Canada Department of Agriculture; (b) Research officer, animal husbandry division, Department of Agriculture, 1953-59; chief of scientific information section research branch, Department of Agriculture, 1959-1965. Dr. Rosario Pelletier: (a) Special advisor, ARDA, Department of Forestry and Rural Development; (b) 23 years director of experimental farm, Ste. Anne de la Pocatière; assistant director ARDA since its inception in 1961; consultant with the World Bank (UN) on economic planning, Morocco, 1967; chief of FAO mission for the United Nations in Iran, 1952-54.
