COURT CHALLENGES PROGRAM

Mr. David Dingwall (Cape Breton – East Richmond): Mr. Speaker, I have a number of petitions that I would like to table pursuant to Standing Order 36. These petitions have been signed by Canadians across this country who are objecting to the government's decision to cancel the Court Challenges Program.

This particular program has allowed many individuals and minority groups to clarify through the courts their constitutional linguistic and equality rights.

They call upon the Government of Canada to rescind this decision and reinstate the Court Challenges Program. Some of these individuals come from Kingston, Ontario, and others come from New Brunswick, Newfoundland, the other Atlantic provinces, the Western provinces, Ontario and Quebec.

FISHERIES

Mr. David D. Stupich (Nanaimo-Cowichan): Mr. Speaker, I am pleased to present a petition pursuant to Standing Order 36 wherein the petitioners ask the federal government to do everything in its power to stop drift-net fishing in the north Pacific ocean.

They point out that an ecological disaster is being perpetrated by Japanese, Korean and Taiwanese driftnet fishing fleets in the north Pacific. Sea birds and marine mammals are being slaughtered by the thousands in the monofilament drift-nets used by the above mentioned fleets.

The west coast salmon fishery is being damaged by this fishing practice. There is also a great possibility of this practice having a horrendous effect on the global ecosystem and our own environment. The petitioners call upon Parliament to do everything it can to stop this.
