It seems to me not at all necessary to go to the trouble of having a University committee, as this does not appear to be required by Dr. Parmelee. I would make the foll wing suggestions:-That Miss Bosvell give you a notice to post as you suggest. This is an outside not a University venture and must be treated as such. That women candidates be interviewed by yourself and that men candidates should be approved by Dean MacKay, acting oot on behalf of the University but on behalf of the promoters of this excellent plan. I am sure Dean MacKay would do this if he were asked. It may appear to you that we are throwing cold water on the plan, but I am afraid that we must from the outset establish the fact that the University as such is not responsible for its execution.
