My dear Principal,

The enclosed sheet showing the geographical distribution of students in the first year during this session may be of interest to you. The large number of students living in Montreal homes and the increasing number of women in the B.A. course throw some light on many of our problems at present. The number of students coming from the Province of Quebec outside of Montreal is, you will observe, very small, and I am inclined to think that educational conditions in the English-speaking country communities in this Province are at a very low ebb. Possibly, however, Bishop's College at Lennoxville may place a different interpretation on these figures.
