Acts 8 V. c. 42, I. The Act passed in the eighth year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, An Act the better to facilitate optional commutation of the tenure of lands on roture in the seigniories and fiefs, in Lower Canada, into that of franc-alcu roturier, and the Act passed in the twelfth year of Her Majesty's

And 12 V. c. 49 Reign, and intituled, An Act to amend the Act passed in the eighth year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act the "better to facilitate optional commutation of the tenure of "lands en roture in the seigniories and fiefs, in Lower Caragards soigniories to which this Act of franc-aleu roturier," shall be and they are hereby repealed in so far as regards the seigniories to which this Act applies: but deeds of commutation granted, or other things done under them, shall remain in full force and have the same effect as if the said Acts had not been

repealed.

Governor to appoint Commissioners.

II. It shall be lawful for the Governor to appoint Commissioners under this Act, and, from time to time, to remove them and to appoint others in the place of any removed, or dying, or resigning office; and each of the said Commissioners shall, before entering upon the duties of his office, take and subscribe, before a Judge of the Superior Court, the following oath:

Their cath of "I, , swear that I will faithfully, and without office." partiality, fear, favor or affection, perform my duty as "Commissioner under the Seigniorial Act of 1854."

Remuniration. III. The said Commissioners shall receive for their services under this Act, and for their necessary expenses and disbursements, such compensation as shall be allowed to them respectively by the Governor, and no other fees or emoluments whatsoever.
