

PLACE-NAMES

- Peters Island, and Cape Traverse P. E. I.; the landing place.
- pebāk*, stream near Shubenacadie settlement; the wilderness.
- pedāwispak*, Third lake on Tangier River; barren lake.
- pedoomkijoik*, place in Miramichi.
- pegoodebek*, Oyster Pond, Jeddore; a second apartment.
- pejeboogwasēs*, place near Richelieu; the little long-flowing stream.
- peleguloolkek*, Onslow River; smooth-flowing water.
- pemankēak*, Sand Island Miramichi, [2] Cavendish, P. E. I.; the sandy beach.
- pēmsik*, Wallace.
- pēnooek*, Kentville, Pineo's place
- pepkuse*, ; branch of the Stewiack River.
- pesigilk*, Pisquid, P. E. I., (2) the Avon at Windsor; entering at right angles.
- peskebak*, Fish Lake; branching off.
- pestumookwādik*, Passamaquoddy Bay; pollock grounds.
- petkootkeak*, Petitcodiac River, bending around.
- petubokē*, Bras d'or Lake; a long basin of salt water.
- pijeboogwek*, Sable River Shelb. Co.; (2) place in Richelieu.
- pijeloviskat*, Lahave River.
- piktook*, Pictou; air explosions
- piktoojook*, Martin's River, near Mahone Bay.
- pilbōk*, Long Lake near Truro.
- plegun*, Cape Split; an opening made in a beaver-dam.
- plēkteok*, Blomidon; (2) the columnar rocks at Cape Split; a handspike; Tradition has it that Glooscap used one of these handspikes to open up the passage at Cape Split, and drain the Annapolis Valley.
- pogoosumkek-booklābā*, St. Peter's Bay, P. E. I.; the Bay of clams.
- pogopskegek*, Onslow or North River.
- pogumkek*, Pomket; raining along.
- pogumkooigilk*, a place near Pomket.
- pogumkook*, Pubnico.
- pogumkootc*, a place in Restigouche.
- pogwek*, Lake near Hammond's Plains; smoky lake, or dry lake.
- pooditck*, Lake Major; the sitting-down place.
- poogudoopskwodik*, Porcupine Head; C. B.
- poogumejooōkade*, White Island.
- pookudāpskwāde*, Cape Porcupine.
- poosuk*, Third lake on Liverpool River.
- punākade*, West River, (2) Sheet Harbor Lake; the place of bringing forth.
- putek*, or *eptek*, Bedeque P. E. I.; the hot place.
