

LINER ANCONA WAS UNARMED

Attack by Submarine Had No Justification, Says Italian Government.

NINE AMERICANS LOST

Latest Estimate is That More Than Two Hundred Lives Perished.

ROME, Nov. 14.—(Via London)—The Italian Government has sent an official communication to the neutral governments dealing with the sinking by a submarine of the Italian liner Ancona.

A statement issued today by the Italian emigration office is that of ten Americans on the Ancona only one was saved, and that of a total of 297 passengers and crew only 239 were saved, making the loss of lives 208.

The note declares that the submarine began to cannonade the Ancona with a wireless apparatus, the decks and even the boats in which passengers were attempting to escape.

Many of these adds the note, were killed or wounded, while many who approached the submarine were driven off with jeers. Thus nearly 200 people were drowned.

Deny Lack of Warning

BERLIN, Nov. 14.—(Via wireless to Seyville).—The Austro-Hungarian admiralty today officially announced that the Italian steamship Ancona attempted to escape at full speed after a warning shot had been fired across her bow, and that the vessel only stopped after being shelled several times by an Austrian submarine.

BIG MONTHLY TAX PLACED ON BELGIUM

Eight Million Dollars Demanded by General Von Bisping.

BRUSSELS, Nov. 14, via London.—Governor-General Von Bisping has imposed upon Belgium a monthly war contribution of 40,000,000 francs (\$8,000,000) towards covering the needs of the army and the cost of administering occupied territories.

The contributions are based upon article 23 of the Hague convention, which provides that the occupying power shall be liable for the maintenance of the army and the cost of administering occupied territories.
