In doing so, he followed the career of the destructive scale in different parts of the United States, pointing out the means by which it works, and the difficulty of eurbing it. It would thrive on maples, elms and other forest trees, as well as on fruit trees. This pest could not be reached by the means of the ordinary spraying process. It had been thought at first that the chief seat of the pest had been traced to an orchard in the Niagara district, and the Government had tried to buy the owner out, with a view to destroying all his trees. The owner, however, had objected, and since then the area affected by the pest had increased eight-fold. If the pest were allowed to go another year it would get beyond control. Mr. Dryden explained that his bill made it imperative for owners of infected orchards to notify the Government, and gave the Government power to destroy diseased trees. The bill also provided that the Government may on the advice of its inspectors indemnify those whose trees were destroyed to the extent of 25 per cent. of their loss.

In reply to Mr. Whitney, Mr. Dryden stated that he did not think the pest was injurious to human health. It simply sucked the life out of the trees.
