

JOCKEY PIERCE SUSPENDED

Fred Perkins Fell Over Last Jump Wednesday at New Orleans and Judge Rees Acts.

OTHER SUSPENSIONS CONTINUED

Potomac Beat Topmast at Oakland, the Favorite, Rosamond, Running Bird.

New Orleans, Dec. 28.—In the case of A. J. Wallace, Jockey R. Sheppard and the horse George Lee, suspended on Dec. 12, the stewards have decided to continue the suspension indefinitely.

The weather today was threatening but the racing continued on the outside. Torugas and Agitator were the only winning favorites.

Donna Rita came to life in the third race and won easily. The possibility of the establishment of the reciprocal relations between the Jockey Club and the Turf Congress excited considerable interest here, and many horses were bet on Tuesday and Friday.
