LABOR LEAGUE OF AMERICA

Twentieth Annual Convention of the American Federation Opened Yesterday at Louisville.

BRITISH AND CANADIAN DELEGATES

President Gompers Reported a Year of Wonderful Growth—Seeks to Avoid Strikes.

Louisville, Ky., Dec. 6.—The twentieth annual convention of the American Federation of Labor met today in Music Hall, with 217 delegates in their seats. Representatives were present from the British Trades Union Congress and the Canadian Trades and Labor Congress.

President Gompers' Address. After the preliminary formalities, President Gompers delivered his annual address, in which he said, in substance, that the year had witnessed a most remarkable growth in organization among the workers, who have realized that there is no protection for their interests or hope for justice and freedom in the future unless it results from the unity of wage-working masses.
