A despatch from Lisbon says: A tend-A despatch from Lisbon says: A tendency is shown by the Boer refugees here to appeal to the British government to grant them their liberty in return for submission to England. The British Consul here has received several letters from the camp at Alcobaca to that effect. A Boer prisoner, presumably an Italian mercenary, after escaping from the Fort of Peniche, near Lisbon, robbed a church in the neighborhood of nearly all its silver and gold offerings, and all the jewelry of and gold offerings, and all the jewelry of an image of "Our Lady of Sorrows," which was considered as possessing miraculous qualities and was covered with valuofferings from the faithful.

Expects No Intervention. A despatch from Berlin says: The Lokal Anzeiger publishes an interview with Dr. Leyds, who again asserted that his presence in Berlin had no political mortive. He said he objected to being interview. viewed, but nevertheless spoke quite free-ly. The war, he declared, might last for years. The Boers could hold out for years, and, moreover, they had eliminated the doubtful element from their ranks, and those now in the field had nothing more to lose. The "brutal methods of conducting the war adopted by the British," added Dr. Leyds, "hardens our opposition."
He denied that the Boers expected intervention, and declared that he was in no way connected with the proposal to boycott British ships. All agitations to induce the Boers to surrender would be useless. They were ready to conclude peace if their cause—were submitted to the Court of karbitration or if their independence were granted. The report of the interview is probably genuine, as it is signed. Dr. Leyds left Berlin last night for Utrecht.


