Report Shows That Membership Has Increased From 424 to 472 in One Year.


The Ontario United Empire Loyalist 'Association held its fifth annual meeting yesterday afternoon in the Confederation Life Building, Lieut.-Col. Shaw presiding. The secretary, Miss Nina N. Clarkson, read the annual report, showing that the membership has increased from 424 to 472 during the past year. A petition to the Minister of Militia has been diafted for the preservation of the Butler's Rangers graveyard at Niagara and the per-petuation of the memory of that corps by a suitable monument. A branch, of the association has been recently organized at St. Catharines, and the branch at Hamilton was reported to be having an encourging growth. The finance report shows that the re-ceipts for the year were \$276.68, and the expenditure \$276.31, leaving a ba-lance of 37 cents.
