

PRESIDENT OF LOYALISTS

Fifth Annual Meeting of the Ontario United Empire Association Held Yesterday.

REV. R. E. A. LAND ELECTED CHIEF

Report Shows That Membership Has Increased From 424 to 472 in One Year.

The Ontario United Empire Loyalist Association held its fifth annual meeting yesterday afternoon in the Conference Life Building, Lieut.-Col. Shaw presiding. The secretary, Miss Nina N. Clarkson, read the annual report, showing that the membership has increased from 424 to 472 during the past year. A petition to the Minister of Militia has been drafted for the protection of the Butlers Rangers' graveyard at Niagara, and the preservation of the memory of that corps by a suitable monument. A branch of the association has been recently organized at St. Catharines, and the branch at Hamilton was reported to be having an encouraging growth.

The finance report shows that the receipts for the year were \$270.50, and the expenditure \$276.31, leaving a balance of 57 cents.

Alfred Wilson presented the association with a diagram showing the exact location in Queen's Park of the Loyalist tree, which was planted last year.

A very well-composed and interesting paper, "Parker Allen of Adolphus-town," was read by the vice-president, Rev. C. E. Thompson.

Rev. C. E. Thompson, who was elected president, read a paper on the death of a short time ago, was one of the fathers of the association, and up to the time of his demise had a deep interest in the work.

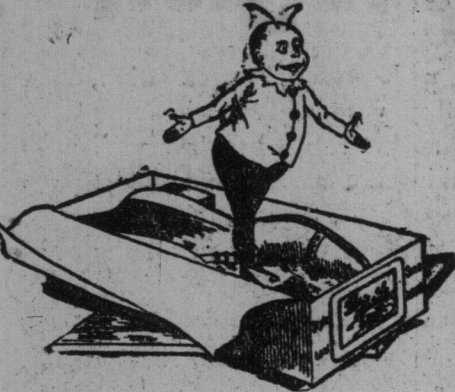

INEXCUSABLE NEGLECT.

Well-known Physician of Washington Held on Serious Charge.

Washington, March 13.—Dr. Charles E. Hagner, for thirty years a well-known physician in this city, and a member of one of the oldest families in this section, was to-day held for the action of the grand jury as the result of an inquest over the body of a recently deceased woman, Mrs. P. Blair, found yesterday afternoon doubled up in a shoe box thrown into a garbage box in the rear of a house. At the inquest to-day a colored woman pointed to Dr. Hagner as the man who saw the body in the shoe box. The latter admitted he was the man, and said he fully believed the child was dead at the time. The physician at the hospital where the child was carried after being found testified that the babe was born alive when received, and the negro woman claimed the child was crying when she found it. The coroner's jury in its verdict held that the child, which was born alive and died, died of hemorrhage of the brain, which might have been caused during the delivery, but that Dr. Hagner, who attended at the birth, was guilty of inexcusable neglect.

CYCLONE IN MISSISSIPPI.

Half a Dozen Persons Killed and Much Property Damaged.

Vicksburg, Miss., March 13.—A cyclone swept through the southern end of Copiah and the northern section of Lincoln counties yesterday, killing at least half a dozen people, and leveling buildings, trees and fences. Monticell, a village in Copiah, on the Illinois Central Railroad was the worst sufferer, and four bodies are known to be under the debris of collapsed buildings. Three miles further south a railroad camp was wrecked, and three negroes killed.
