GERMANY'S ADMISSION TO LEAGUE OPPOSED BY FRANCE

FRANCE POSITIVELY REFUSES TO BRITISH

Threatens "Drastic Action" If League Council Voted For Germans' Entry—Great Britain Was Inclined To Favor German Membership, But Owing to France's Opposition Is Now Willing to Leave Matter in Abeyance.

Paris, Nov. 12.—The French Government is unalterably opposed to the admission of Germany to the league of nations at this time, it was stated at the foreign office today. Some "drastic action" would be a consequence if the league voted to admit Germany, it was intimated.

The foreign office said there had been conversations with Great Britain on the subject and that the British, who had been inclined to favor German membership in the league, had now accepted the French viewpoint, allowing the matter to rest for the present.

Ottawa, Nov. 12 .- Announcement that Premier Drury of On tario will speak with Hon. T. A. Crerar, leader of the Federal Farmers' party, in Winnipeg during December next has created considerable interest in political circles here. This will be the Ontario premier's first appearance on a federal platform. He and his cabinet have kept out of the East Elgin fight and have generally kept aloof from federal affairs.

There has, however, been a fairly persistent rumor that Mr Drury has federal aspirations, and his name has been frequently mentioned as successor to Mr. Crerar. The latter, apart from his important and onerous business connections, has never been enamored of politics, and his present position as leader of the Federal Farmers' party is rather a matter of chance than of appointment. He was elected, not on the Farmers' ticket, but on the Unionist ticket in 1917, and there has been no Farmers' convention confirming his present position. He himself made reference to this fact at Prince Albert recently.

While Premier Drury has quite a sufficient responsibility as leader of the Ontario Government, it would not be surprising here were he to decide to embark on federal politics.
