

U. S. GOLFERS DEFEAT CANADA

In Annual Match for the Devonshire Trophy—Prize Winners.

Ottawa, Sept. 10.—The Duke of Devonshire Trophy, presented for annual competition between the teams of the Senior Golf Associations of Canada, and the United States, goes back to the American side for another year. In the match between Canada and the United States this afternoon the American team won, 20 to 15. The Canadians got away to a grand start, and in the light of the first few games, it looked as though they would regain the governor-general's cup, which they lost at Kye, N.Y., last year, but the visiting golfers made very strong finish, and won the majority of the games, all of which took place under the Nassau system. UNCONSCIOUS BY A STING.

To look at a caterpillar after it has been stung by a bee or wasp one would imagine it to be dead. In most cases, however, this is not so. The caterpillar has only been sent into a kind of stupor, from which it never wakes. Sometimes the victim dies, but then the poison injected by the other insect acts as a preservative and prevents the body from decaying. There are several kinds of wasps known, when they lay eggs, surround them with caterpillars, in order that the young when they appear, may be well supplied with food. And the action of the wasp's poison upon the dead or paralyzed caterpillars ensures that this food shall be fresh food, of a nature wonderful.
