Beane Letter 30 January 93
To the Deputy
of the S. G. & A.
Sir.

In reply to your letter dated the 4 inst, No. 99258, I have the honor to inform you that the street mentioned in your letter as the "proposed road" has been opened ever since the Beane village has been in existence, I could not say however how many years since.

I should also add that the street in question never was opened to the Whites, ~~public~~, on the contrary it was kept opened solely for the use and the benefit of the Indians and not for the Whites, this street being within the limits of the Beane village.

I have also the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your "Special Notice" dated the 25 inst, No. 99258, and by to say that the delay in my replying was due to my having to visit the return home, from hunting of some of the old Indians, in order to obtain
