### COURTS AND POLICE


Both at last week's and this week's meeting of the board of trade to discuss civic affairs complaint was made con-cerning the administration of justice in the courts. A feeling that has been steadily growing for several years is now finding expression, and will be expressed still more vigorously if there is no change as 'a result of the protests made. Not only is the work of a police department rendered largely futile if it is not strongly backed up by the courts, but a feeling of contempt for the law is developed in the minds of delinquents, and the tendency toward general lawlessness becomes more pronounced. We are not to have the enlarged police force which a city the size of St. John should have, and there is therefore all the more reason why the courts should strengthen to the utmost the hands of the chief and his staff in the difficult work they are called upon to perform with an inadequate number of patrolmen. In the case of extremely young offenders leniency is justified so long as there is any assurance that the culprits will be subjected to better influences, and encouraged to do better after their release; but the more hardened criminals should not be encouraged to believe they can pursue their career with impunity.
