

HE GIVES UP A LARGE PENSION

Lord Strathclyde Relinquishes
£3,750 a Year Granted
When He Retired.

London, Aug. 30.—(Associated Press, by Mail).—Lord Strathclyde has astonished the official world by voluntarily relinquishing a pension of £3,750, a year that was granted him seven years ago when he retired from the office of Lord Advocate for Scotland, where he was getting £20,000 a year.

He is sixty years old and declares his reason for giving up the pension is that he is unable, owing to weak health, to take part in the judicial work of the House of Lords. That has only increased the surprise his action has occasioned. Such an exhibit of public spirit is rare indeed.

The British government makes generous provision for the future welfare of its best-paid office holders when they join the ranks of those who have retired. The speaker of the House of Commons has a salary of £5,000 a year; he may retire whenever he wants to and enjoy a life pension of £4,000 a year. The Lord Chancellor, who fills a role in the House of Lords analogous to the speaker of the House of Commons, receives a salary of £10,000 a year and retired pay of £5,000.

DEATH THREATENED UNLESS \$25,000 PAID BY HEAD OF MOIRS

Halifax, Sept. 15.—On September 11 James W. Moir, president of Moirs, Ltd., this city, received a clumsily worded letter warning him that unless he left \$25,000 in cash in a certain spot in Point Pleasant Park by September 15, he would be assassinated on that date. The letter was signed "Member."

This afternoon, after consulting the police, Mr. Moir deposited a "dummy" roll in the tin can which was found hidden, according to instructions in the letter, just inside the park gates. Later

KEEP EXPOSITION OPEN TILL MARCH.

Brazilian Display a Big Attraction in Which Nations Take Interest.

Rio De Janeiro, Aug. 25.—(Associated Press by Mail).—Although the Brazilian officials are not disposed to postpone any part of the Centennial Celebration programme which will open according to schedule September 7, it is now generally conceded that a considerable part of the big exposition will not get into its stride before six weeks or two months after that date. Many of the exposition buildings, including the American pavilion, will not be ready for occupancy before October.

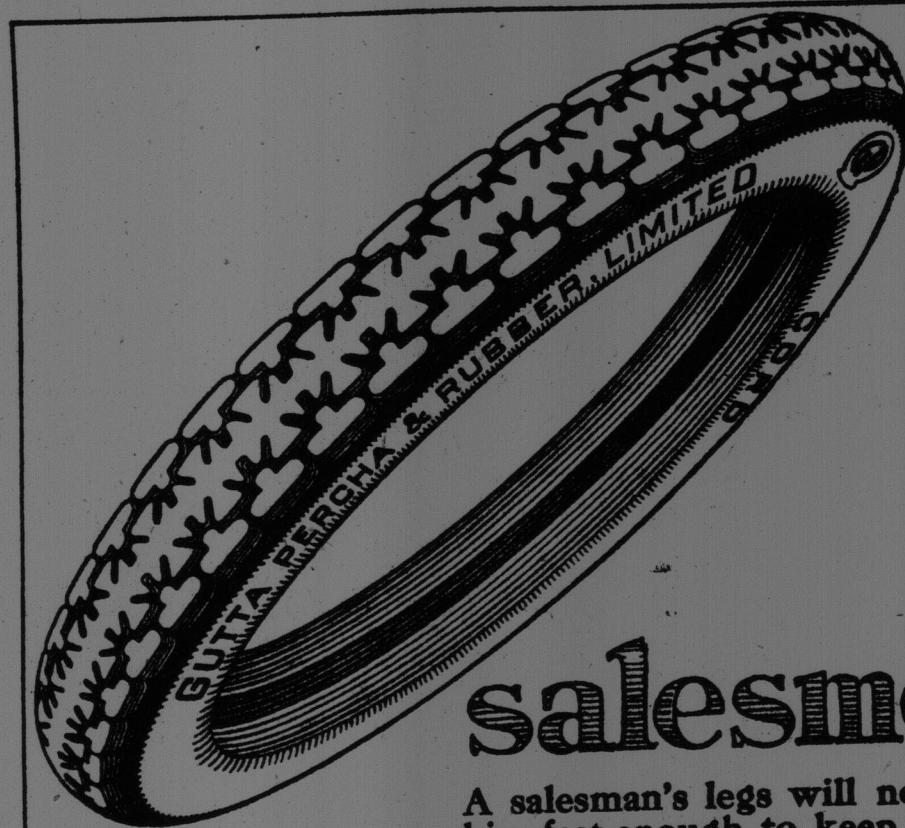
Work has proceeded, however, to the point where it is obvious that the exposition will be well worth seeing. Organized, arranged, and constructed with the art characteristic of the Brazilians, the groups of buildings will do credit to the far famed beauty of Rio de Janeiro. The various edifices which will house and portray the principal industries and scientific and artistic developments of the country reflect to a remarkable extent the spirit and character of the Brazilian people.

All of the great nations will be represented, and their buildings, most of which are of permanent construction will form what will be one of the most charming sections of this capital. Each of these buildings will contain exhibits of its country's arts and industries. The centennial programme includes the largest military review ever held in South America. Chosen troops of the reserve from every Brazilian state will march. There will be open-air operas and symphony concerts; national and international conventions; free motion picture shows; a naval review; civic parades; Olympic games; official and unofficial entertainments and receptions; a carnival, and fireworks displays. Festivities are being spent for special and spectacular illumination effects.

The conventions and congresses range from the International Railway Convention to the Canary Birds Fanciers' annual meeting. Extraordinary interest centres around the livestock show which is expected to draw exhibits from every cattle-raising country in the world. The Good Roads Convention, Agricultural Congress, and Engineering Conference are among the important events on the programme.

The importance which foreign countries give to the Brazilian celebration is indicated by the men they have chosen to head their delegations to the official ceremonies. Secretary of State Charles E. Hughes heads the American mission; Admiral Thaon de Revel that from Italy and Marshal Joffre from France. It is anticipated that there will be a constant attendance of from 75,000 to 100,000 people during the entire exposition, which will not close until March 31, 1923.
