CAT PROVED
AID TO MAN

Copenhagen, Jan. 7.—To Newton's apple
and Watt's tea kettle now to be added
Finsen's cat as a humble contributor to the

hagen on September 24, 1904.

BIG LIQUOR SEIZURE IN
NEW YORK RESTAURANT

New York, Jan. 7.—Prohibition agents
yesterday raided Jack's restaurant at
Sixth avenue and 43rd street and hauled
away nearly \$100,000 worth of liquor.

The Kronprinzpalais, in Unter der

rooms for the entertainment of visiting
committees.

Schloss Bellevue, in the Tiergarten,
where the Kaiser really lived and where
he made some of his most famous ap-
pointments, now houses the various
"home societies," such as the one for the
protection of cruelty to Upper Silesia, in
one of its wings another wing has been
converted into apartment houses, while
the best furniture has been packed and
stored in the old ballroom.

Others are being used as dormitories
for indigent students, hospitals for all
classes, and clubrooms. Still others have
been converted into libraries. One is be-
ing made into an orthopaedic institute
for wounded veterans. One is empty.
And the Neues Palais, in Potsdam,
has been rented to the leaders of the
Dancing School.

for distribution two hundred additional
poison letters.

The ingenuity of this person in carry-
ing on his malicious campaign is re-
markable. He addresses a letter attack-
ing Monsieur X to Monsieur Y, with a
request that, after reading it, he present
it to Monsieur X. This insures wide-
spread knowledge of the mendacious
charges. Further mystery is added by the
fact that letters are delivered personally
and left beneath doors. In this the
"Tiger's Eye" lives up to his name, as he
not only avoids ambushes, but the next
day informs those who have waited for
him of the fulfillment of their efforts.

In important rage, the municipal coun-
