

Ontario Farmers to Do Labor on Rural Lines.

Toronto, May 10.—It is proposed by the Ontario Hydro-Electric Power Commission that farmers shall provide labor for the construction of the proposed rural lines. The farmers will be offered the prevailing rate of pay for workers and for teams, it is understood, and as the farmers will be drawn from their immediate localities, they will be able to do the work in their spare time.


