their nurture. The highest calling is that of fitting the next generation. Can anyone deny it or question it? Even for the church which preaches the gospel, the greatest and highest task is the nurture of the young. But how does Canada face this question practically? The elders of the village get together and consider how little they can get a teacher for. Or they regard some annual sum, from one or two hundred dollars a year upwards, as the amount they are able to pay, and get whatever teacher they can for that. It may be a little pin money for a daughter of some member of the board of school trustees. Or the minister's daughter might be got to do it. Perhaps we are stating the case at its worst. But we venture the assertion that the least Canada ought to do in this matter is to double the salaries of all the school teachers. Why, they

are not worth it, says some one. That is not the question. The service of making the next generation—the nation of twenty years hence—is worth it. If those at present in the service are not worth it, and in some cases no doubt they are not, it soon would be supplied by such as are worth it. Indeed, in some cases, doubling the stipend would not meet the case.
