IMPROVE CONDITIONS

London, June 18.—(Via Reuters' Ottawa Agency)—In the House of Commons yesterday George P. Roberts, minister of labor, moved the second reading of the board of trade's bill. He said there were now 390,000 workers and 17,000 firms under the board of trade act. Now it was proposed to empower the board to fix a guaranteed minimum time and rate, and also to fix differential rates for overtime. It was also proposed to establish a system for accelerating the fixing of compulsory minimum rates of wages.

Mr. Roberts admitted that he had been immensely attracted by the idea of parliament fixing a national minimum wage, but closer examination showed many difficulties. Therefore, the government was aiming at gradually improving conditions in each industry and getting employers and workers to co-operate in improving their own conditions.
