Still it is unwise for Johnson to count the chickens before they are hatched, for you cannot tell what Uncle Samuel is liable to do in his case.

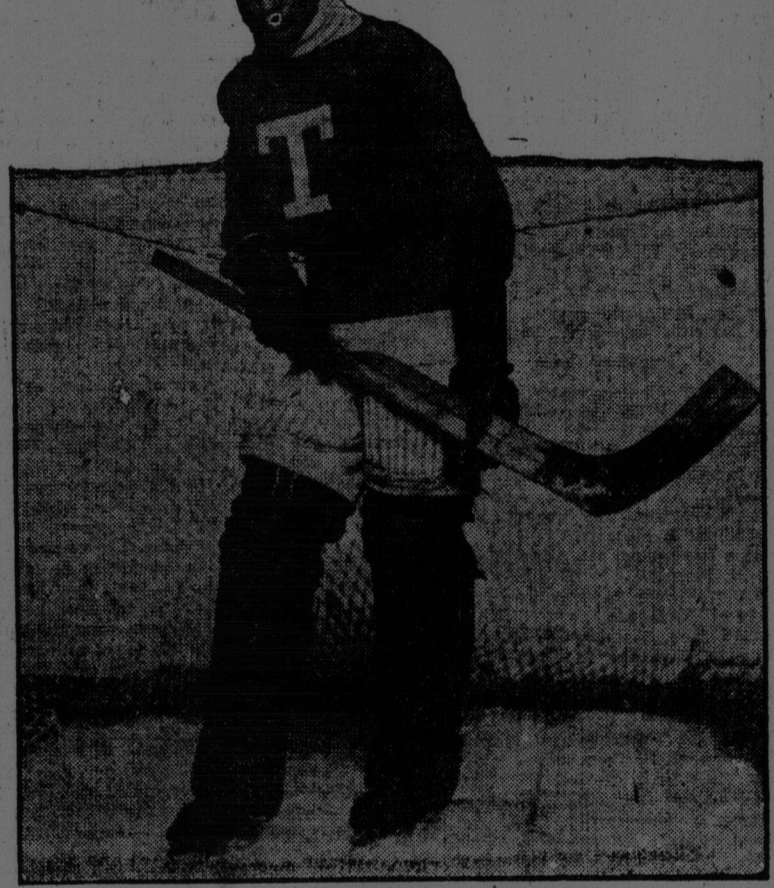
