> 3. No person shall, by word of mouth or in writing, spread reports likely to create disaffection or alarm among any of His Majesty's forces, or among the civil population.

Any person who attempts to com mit, or procures, aid or abets, the commission of any act prohibited by the foregoing special regulations, or har bours any person whom he knows, or has reasonable grounds for supposing to have acted in contravention of such regulations, shall be deemed to have acted in contravention of the regulations in like manner as if he had committed the act.

London, Nov. 1 .- Germany's plans n the Riga district have been com pletely demoralized by the successful campaign of British submarines in the Baltic Sea, and the complete closing of the Gulf of Riga by Russian mine fields, says the Petrograd correspon to tower by a covered passage dent of the Post. The Germans are now endeavouring, with most fever ish energy, to hasten restoration of the slender and inadequate service in their rear. This work, heretofore, has been earried on in a leisurely fashion, because of the belief that present needs could be adequately served by sea routes. This plan of campaign has been made more vital by early snow storms, which the Russians declare presage a winter of unusual severity. The belief here is that when the Ger mans are compelled to underge the rigour of a real Russian winter, con stantly annoyed by guarilla attacks, and with an adequate supply of facili ties. they will lose more men by sick ness, and suffer greater demoralization, than comes from even the worst deteats in the field.


